OUR NEXT MEETING— "ARE YOU READY FOR SOME FOOTBALL???" Our next meeting will be Tuesday October 16 at 7:30pm in the Haddon Heights Library-Lower Level. Join us next Tuesday evening and relive the "Golden Days" of big time Haddon Heights Football as Lloyd "Jack" Johnson and Carl Wilson highlight a panel which will share their memories of the 1943 and 1944 Varsity "Super Teams of Second Avenue", coached by George "Speedy" Baker. Our moderator for this special look back will be the noted sportswriter and author, Doug Frambes, of the Retrospect.

In April of 2007, the Retrospect reflected on these magical seasons as follows: "The 1943 Haddon Heights football team compiled a record of 8-0-0, winning the South Jersey Group III title. With only a few returning lettermen, coach George "Speedy" Baker constructed one of the strongest and smoothest running teams ever to represent Haddon Heights... Joe Teti directed the team as quarterback while Carl Wilson and Bruce Allan added points to the scoreboard. Lloyd 'Jack' Johnson made many pass interceptions while 'Coop" Bartholomew forced the tackles. On Thanksgiving Day, undefeated Haddonfield was beaten 12-0. "... "The 1944 football team continued the success that the 1943 team started, with a 7-0-1 record. This year's team was the last time any South Jersey team went through an entire season without being scored upon".

The traditional Turkey Day tilt between Haddonfield and Haddon Heights always drew a sizeable crowd. In 1944, 11,000 fans from both sides came out to see the action on the gridiron with Haddon Heights completing an undefeated, un– scored upon season!! No doubt, a few surprise guests will be in our pro– Garnets audience. Please come out and WEAR YOUR SCHOOL COLORS, whether they be garnet and gold, crimson and black, or some other combination! Admission is free, and we encourage you to bring any sports-minded family members with you to cheer on our heroes. (In the magnanimous spirit of the occasion, even those who root for the Bulldogs are welcome to this historic panel discussion). We hope to see you at the Library for Tuesday Night Football.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE: Elephant consumed! I am sure that most of you have heard the old adage about how to eat an elephant ... one bite at a time, which is how we approached the long-overdue revision of our Constitution and By-Laws. I would like to thank Anne McAdams for her dedication and determination over the past 11 months in keeping the process moving forward. Thanks also to the members of the Board who endured multiple virtual and regular meetings reviewing the 22 official revisions for input so that add/changes could be made to better communicate the mission of our Society and the roles and responsibilities of the Board and Committee members. In addition to quite a lot of word-smithing, the most significant changes to the Constitution & By-Laws

are: 1) Meeting dates of future Society meetings have been changed to the 3rd MONDAY of January, April, July and October. The reason is that we have been conflicting with Borough public meetings on the same evening, and we believe residents are having to decide which meeting to attend; 2) Roles and responsibilities of your officers and committee members are more clearly defined; 3) Household membership category with \$12 annual dues has been added to the individual membership category (\$8 annual dues); and 4) Both documents are now in sync with one another and in compliance with IRS 501(c)(3) guidelines for non-profit organizations. Please review both documents, as you will be asked to approve them at this Quarterly meeting.

The business portion of the meeting will be as short as possible, so we can fully enjoy the program Ginny Appleby and Peter Hill have put together for us. Our fourth quarter meeting will be an exciting one, as speakers Lloyd "Jack" Johnson and Carl Wilson, players on the Super Teams of Second Avenue during the fabled years of 1943-1944, take us back to a time when Heights ruled the gridiron. Thanks also to Doug Frambes, sportswriter extraordinaire / author, for moderating and providing his insight on the teams and South Jersey sports during the war years. Wear your school colors. Letter sweaters, HS jackets and pom-poms acceptable!

Lastly, since our meeting time will be tight and the holidays are just around the corner, I would suggest you <u>ARRIVE EARLY</u> to make sure you have a good seat and...BRING YOUR CHECKBOOKS to get a head start on your paperwork and holiday shopping.
