

Monday evening July 16th at 7:00pm in the AIR CONDITIONED Haddon Heights Li-

brary. Mr. Bill Lange, noted historian, speaker and award winning H.S. history teacher will present a multi-media talk entitled "Gettysburg... Fact and Fiction", commemorating the 150th anniversary of the Civil War. Previously, Bill has given lectures to Haddon Heights civic groups on Abraham Lincoln and D-Day. Both were well received. Also joining us on that evening will be a Civil War re-enactor who will display and explain Civil War weaponry. The decisive Battle of Gettysburg, fought over three days in July 1863, was the largest ever North American conflict.

Elena Hill was also presented with a "Proclamation" by Mayor Forte and Council, acknowledging May, 2012 as "Historic Preservation Month". Thank you, Peter Hill for framing it for the library. After the dedication, Margaret Westfield led a very informative walking tour down Seventh Avenue, Garden Street, through the railroad tunnel and on both sides of Atlantic Avenue, ending at Stanfill Manor. There is a lot of historical architecture in Haddon Heights, and Margaret shared many facts along the way.

On a special note, the Board of your Historical Society has voted to donate \$5,000 to assist in the preservation of the Railroad Station. The station is currently occupied by the Delaware and Susquehanna Model Railroad Association, who are undertaking this project to preserve this symbol of our town. As a special "Thank You", the Station will be open to the Society on July 16 from 6:30 - 7:00 PM and again on July 18 at 7:00 PM.

We have an exciting meeting planned on July 16th. You might say it has been 149 years in the making... Local resident, Historian, and History Teacher Bill Lange will bring a new perspective to the historical Battle of Gettysburg. This is definitely a meeting you do not want to miss!


