



In addition to reflecting back on Campbell Soup, RCA, and New York Shipbuilding, her slide presentation includes images of the construction of Fairview, street scenes, early images of Cooper and Our Lady of Lourdes hospitals, building of the Ben Franklin Bridge, and much more.
